CHECKLIST FOR THREAT ASSESSMENT AND MANAGEMENT

The following steps are to be taken after a threat has been made at a school site. Some steps may be taken concurrently or in a different order than shown, depending on the circumstances.

 A CONVENE AND NOTIFY: Convene your Threat Assessment and Management Team: School-site administrator, mental health professional, and school police officer. 1 Identify specific threat and determine degree of impact on the school. 2Notify Local District Operations Coordinator 3Determine whether additional support is needed and request it if appropriate: aDistrict Threat Assessment/Management Team bLaw enforcement agency such as LAPD, FBI

B DOCUMENT: Document all steps taken. Strict confidentiality about student information shoul	d
be kept among team members and appropriate District staff.	
C ASSESS: In assessing the validity, review the warning signs and all background information of the child, interview witnesses, staff, peers, etc. <u>DO ALL</u>	
OF THIS BEFORE CONTACTING THE PARENT.	
1Review school history, using a questioning and skeptical mind set.

□ Copy of Emergency Card	
□ Copy of Social Adjustment/Discipline record	
□ Copy of Attendance record	
□ Copy of cum folder cover	
□ Copy of most recent report card and/or progress report

2Interview adults on campus who had contact with the student.	
3 Interview students who may have been threatened and friends of student.	
4Interview the student (use the 11 Key Questions from the Secret Service	
Guidelines).	
5Interview the parents (last).	
aIdentify any new family or individual stressors, including changes in the family, loss or separation, or violence at home or in the neighborhood.	
bAsk if the student or any member of the family is currently receiving	
counseling.	
6Determine the level of risk. The categories are:	
☐ Category 1: High violence potential; qualifies for immediate arrest or hospitalization.	
☐ Category 2: High violence potential; does not qualify for arrest or hospitalization.	
□ Category 3: Insufficient evidence for violence potential; sufficient evidence for the	
repetitive/intentional infliction of emotional distress upon others. Category 4: Insufficient evidence for violence potential; sufficient evidence for the	
unintentional infliction of emotional distress upon others.	
☐ Category 5: Insufficient evidence for violence potential; insufficient evidence for	
emotional distress upon others.
